Origins of Tournament - 1942

- The Macedonian Open Golf Tournament was first established in **1942** by a group of young Macedonian businessmen who used to get together every Tuesday afternoon for a round of golf. At the end of the year they would have a tournament amongst themselves that they called the **Macedonian Open**.

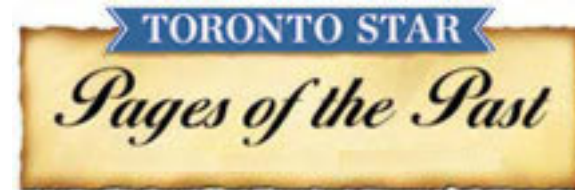

MACEDONIANS RAISE \$3,328 FOR RUSSIA

Progressive People Express
Loyalty to Canada

Macedonian and Bulgarian Progressive People raised \$3,328 which was brought into Toronto branch Red Cross headquarters for the Russian relief fund. Money was raised through collections among members and friends of this group, and by a concert at 386 Ontario St. A meeting, which was attended by fifty people at the same address, netted over \$1,000. There are not more than 5,000 Macedonian and Bulgarians scattered across the Dominion, and the immigration has come about very recently. It is their desire to express sincere loyalty to their new country, Canada.

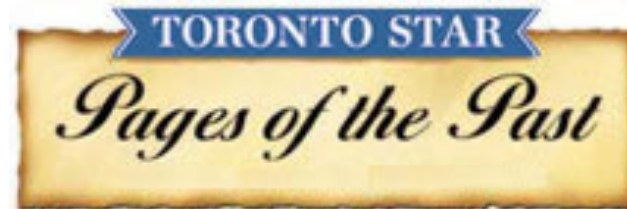
HOCKEY PUCKS AND GOLF BALLS ON BANNED LIST

They did so when Munitions and Supply Minister C. D. Howe announced that “without exception, no rubber will be released in future for the manufacture of non-essentials.”

Macedonian Cry

- The term “**Macedonian Cry**” came from the bible (Acts 16:9) wherein a man appeared to Paul asking him to go to Macedonia to help the people there.
- **King James Bible (Cambridge Ed.)** And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us. And after he had seen the vision, immediately we endeavoured to go into Macedonia, assuredly gathering that the Lord had called us for to preach the gospel unto them.
- The literal definition is an outcry for help.

Macedonian Cry Sept. 21, 1944

"Surrounded here by three **golf** courses and 80 sets of clubs but have no **golf** balls." This SOS reached the committee for troops in training from an R.C.A.F. base overseas, and four dozen of the best were promptly fired across the ocean by Chairman Jack Porter.

The Lakeview Golf and Country Club 1957

After 17 years, the Lakeview Golf Course was once again opened to women. *The Toronto Telegram* headline was “Shirts back on, Gentlemen, the Gals are Here. Lakeview Golf Club ends Women Ban.” Toronto Townships’s male sanctuary had fallen by the wayside. The first hole in one was scored in the 1957 season by Marion Lynd.

The annual membership rates were set at \$125 for men, and \$85 for ladies and \$200 for a husband and wife. For playing on a daily basis, it was \$2.50 for weekdays and \$3.50 for weekends. The course was open from mid April until mid November and the clubhouse was available during the winter months for various functions.

Rain or shine makes no difference to golfers. Yesterday was no exception as 79 fairway faddists attacked Lakeview in the 12th annual Macedonian 'Open' tourney.

Led by Van Petroff, who imported a collection of pros to add distinction to the outing, the group composed mostly of restaurateurs gave the 6,263-yard par-70 layout quite a workout but nobody defeated it.

Stan Ginou with an 87 won the championship and the St. Cyril and Methody trophy. Paul Floroff was second with 88 and Nick Zolumoff Nick Christie and Bob Andrews each posted 89's. Defending champion Phil Georgeff slip-

ped to 94.

Lowest shooter of the day was Roy Romain, Scarborough's assistant pro, with a 72. He received \$50. Host pro Larry Edwards had 74 and Rose-dale's Murray Tucker and York Downs' Normie Smith 77's.

In the net division, Nick Martin won with 97-24-73. George Sanoff had 96-22-74 and Mike Grayson 101-26 1/2-74 1/2. Most honest laurels went to John Anthony, 187. Norm Scott paced the guests with 80.

Dick Wilson captured the third annual Leaside Shrine get-together with a 74 at St. Andrew's. Don Drysdale had 79 and Jim Bailey 88. Top visitor was Doug Longborg with 77. A total of 70 teed off

Macedonian Open Golf Tournament – 1960's

In the early sixties the tournament name was changed to the Macedonian Pro-Amateur Championship and between 6 and 20 professional golfers including Ken Duggan, Alvie Thompson, Bobby Rose, and Joe Noble participated. In order to attract these professionals, Van Petroff put up \$250 in prize money. From its founding the tournament always had a “Macedonian” name and despite political pressure to change it, Van Petroff stood firm and assured the name of the golf tournament would never change.

Took Lessons . . . Wins Title

Who said golf is tough to learn? Not Dr. Chris Yankou.

The 31-year-old physician posted a 79 to win the Macedonian championship at the Pro-Amateur Open tournament yesterday at Whitevale—and he only took up the game two years ago.

It was the doctor's second try for the title. He thinks he scored 110 in his initial bid in 1958.

"I just started golf that year," he said. "Played seriously last year and this year

got a new set of clubs and took some lessons."

In grabbing the 13th annual battle from a field of 90, Yankou edged Phil Georgeff by a stroke. Georgeff, a former multiple winner, bet on himself to triumph again. He then proceeded to three-putt from 35 feet on the 18th hole for a double bogey—and an 80.

Pando Markoff and Bill Federico tied for third, each with 83. Defending champion Stan Ginou had to settle for 86.

Sonny Laco won low net honors with 85-14—71, although he and Paul Phillips tied. Phillips had 84-13—71 but lost on the toss of a coin. Van Petroff, who sponsors the tourney, and Chris Martin had 85-13—72 and 90-18—72, respectively to share show spot. Most honest was Danny Meloff with a whopping 177.

Low amateurs for the day were Johnny Jonhstone and Gordon Brown with 75 apiece and Wilf Sandall at 76—but all were guests. Graham Stewart took handicap honors in this division with 30-11—69.

Alvin Thompson, 24-year-old Northwood assistant, fired a one-under-par 71 to whip 19 other pros and collect \$50. Mel Taylor of Aurora had 72, Gordon DeLaat of Weston 73 and Joe Noble of Thornhill and Bruce Murray of York Downs, each 74.

Phil Georgeff Beats Par To Win Macedonian Golf

In the next 10 to 15 years golf will be completely mechanized. Electric carts will have replaced caddies and the time to play an 18-hole round will have been reduced by two to three hours.

Vic DiMarco, pro at Forest Hills, made the above observations during the 14th annual Macedonian Pro-Amateur championship yesterday. Admitting mechanization of the game would spoil it, DiMarco felt it was inevitable as travelling distances to courses became longer.

While Vic pontificated about the future, Phil Georgeff was busy firing a one-under-par 70 over the 6,061-yard par 71 (36-35) layout to win his fourth championship.

A designer and builder of restaurants, Georgeff previously captured the Van Petroff trophy in 1953, 1956 and 1958. This time he had a 10-shot lead over Robbie Zoluff who finished second with 80. Paul Floroff was third at 81. Defending champion Dr. C. Yankou had 85.

Low net honors—and the Chris Martin trophy—went to Alex Phillips with 89-17—72. He succeeded Alex Laco, 1960 winner, Charhe Evans, 94-22—72, and Peter Stevens, 86-14—72, were second and third respectively.

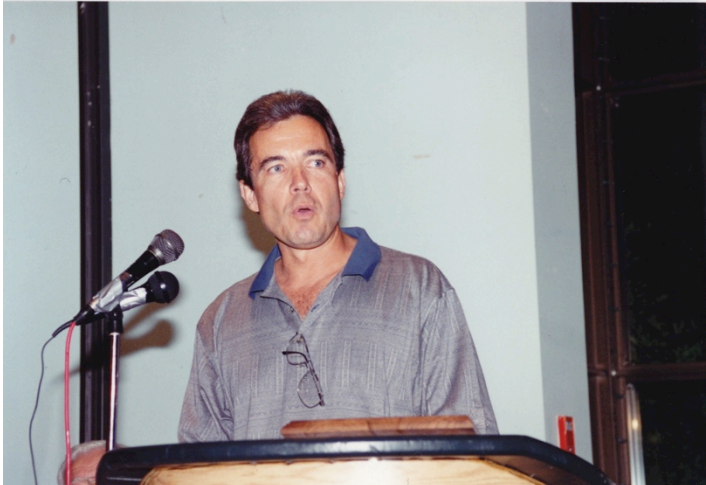
